

At a Regular Meeting of the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, held on the 22nd day of December, 1950.

PRESENT: Mayor Tyrell, Aldermen Holland, LeClair, Villoni, Jerny, and Slattery.

ABSENT: Alderman Cardi.

By Alderman Holland; seconded by Alderman Villoni.

LOCAL LAW NO. 8 OF 1950.

ENTITLED AN ACT providing for the minimum and maximum compensation, rate of increase and time of taking effect of such increases for city officials and creating, continuing, classifying and providing for compensation, rate of increase and time of taking effect of the various employees of the City of Plattsburgh.

BE IT ENACTED by the Mayor and the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, as follows:

SECTION 1. Compensation of City Officials. The salary of the Mayor shall be \$2,300.00 per year. Of that figure \$230.00 (10%) shall be payable by the Municipal Lighting Department; \$460.00 (20%) shall be payable by the Water Department; \$115.00 (5%) shall be payable from Sewer Revenues, and the balance of \$1495.00 shall be payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of each Alderman shall be \$14.00 for each meeting of the Common Council actually attended, but not to exceed the sum of \$700 for each Alderman per annum. payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the City Chamberlain, upon appointment, shall be \$4100.00 per year; the same to be increased annually at the rate of \$100.00 per year until the maximum salary of \$4600.00 is attained. Of that figure (15%) shall be payable by the Municipal Lighting Department; (20%) shall be payable by the Water Department; and (5%) shall be payable from the Sewer Revenues, and the balance of (60%) shall be payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the City Clerk, upon appointment, shall be \$3900.00 per year, the same to be increased at the rate of \$100.00 per year until the maximum salary of \$4400.00 is attained. Of that figure (5%) shall be payable by the Municipal Lighting Department; (20%) shall be payable by the Water Department; (5%) shall be payable from the Sewer Revenues; and (70%) shall be payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Corporation Counsel, shall be \$3300.00 per year. Of that figure (10%) shall be payable by the Municipal Lighting Department; (20%) shall be payable by the Water Department; (5%) shall be payable from the Sewer Revenues and the balance shall be payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of each member of the Municipal Civil Service Commission shall be \$340.00 per year, which shall be payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

Inspectors of Election and such other election officers entitled to be appointed, shall receive compensation which is hereby fixed as follows: Primary Day - \$10.00; each Registration Day - \$10.00 and General Election Day - \$10.00 all of which shall be payable from the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Chief of Police, upon appointment, shall be \$3600.00 per year, the same to be increased at the rate of \$100.00 per year, until the maximum salary of \$4,000.00 is attained, all of which shall be payable from the Police Fund, in the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the City Judge shall be \$3100.00 per year, all of which shall be payable from the City Court and/or the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Acting City Judge shall be \$9.00 per day during which he sits, but not to exceed the sum of \$450.00 in any one year, all of which shall be payable from the City Court and/or the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Fire Chief, upon appointment, shall be \$3300.00 per year, the same to be increased at the rate of \$100.00 per year, until the maximum salary of \$3700.00 is attained, all of which shall be payable from the Fire Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Sealer of Weights and Measurers shall be \$525.00 per year, all of which shall be payable from that appropriation of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Plumbing Inspector shall be \$1000.00 per year; all of which shall be payable from that appropriation in the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Health Officer shall be \$1925.00 per year; all of which shall be payable from the Board of Health of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Superintendent of Water and Sewage, upon appointment, shall be \$4500.00 per year; the same to be increased at the rate of \$100.00 per year, until the maximum salary of \$5500.00 is attained, all of which shall be payable from the Water Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Superintendent of Public Works, upon appointment, shall be \$4500.00 per year, the same to be increased at the rate of \$100.00 per year, until the maximum salary of \$5500.00 is attained. Of that figure (50%) shall be payable from the Water Department; the sum of \$500.00 shall be payable by the Municipal Airport Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts and the balance shall be payable from the Street and Sewer Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Recreation Director, upon appointment, shall be \$3,500.00 per year; the same to be increased at the rate of \$200.00 per year, until the maximum of \$4,100.00 is attained; all of which shall be payable from the Recreation Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of the Secretary of the Airport Commission shall be \$1650.00 per year, all of which shall be payable from the Municipal Airport Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

Supervisors and Constables shall be entitled to receive the same compensation for their services as corresponding officers in the Towns of the County of Clinton are entitled to receive for like services.

SECTION 2. Compensation of City Employees. There shall continue to be in the various departments listed below, the following positions which are classified in the Municipal Civil Service of the City of Plattsburgh, and occupants of which shall receive compensation in accordance with the schedules hereinbelow contained. Column 1 indicates the minimum or entrance compensation for the respective positions; Column 2 indicates the maximum compensation for the respective positions, and Column 3 indicates the rate of annual increase until the maximum compensation in Column 2 is attained.

CITY COURT: The salary of the Clerk of the City Court shall be \$2650.00 per year; all of which shall be payable from the City Court and/or the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

POLICE DEPARTMENT: The salary of the Police Sergeants shall be \$3200.00 per year; all of which shall be payable from the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of each Regular Patrolman shall be as follows:

\$2640.00 for the first year of service,
 \$2750.00 for the second year of service,
 \$2860.00 for the third year of service, and
 \$2970.00 for the fourth year of service, and each succeeding year, all of which shall be payable from the Police Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

FIRE DEPARTMENT: The salary of the Assistant Fire Chief shall be \$3200.00 per year, all of which shall be payable from the Fire Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The salary of each Regular Fireman shall be as follows:

\$2640.00 for the first year of service,
 \$2750.00 for the second year of service,
 \$2860.00 for the third year of service, and
 \$2970.00 for the fourth year and each succeeding year, all of which shall be payable from the Fire Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

The Call Fireman shall be paid at the rate of \$120.00 per year, all of which shall be payable from the Fire Fund of the General Budgetary Accounts.

HOURLY WAGE RATES: Skilled laborers employed in the Public Works Department and the Water and Sewage Department shall receive \$1.20 per hour; semi-skilled laborers shall receive \$1.15 per hour and common laborers shall receive \$1.10 per hour, which shall be payable either from the General Budgetary Accounts (Street and Sewer Fund or Sewer Operation and Maintenance Fund) or from the Water Department, according to the classification of the labor performed. Foreman shall receive \$1.40 per hour.

SECTION 3. Annual Increments for Current Incumbents.

1. Present incumbents among the various city officials, city department heads and city employees who have served in their present positions a number of years equal to that required, on the basis of the annual salary or wage increments, to attain the maximum salaries for their respective positions and who have heretofore received the maximum salaries for their respective positions shall henceforth receive the maximum salaries as herein provided.
2. Present incumbents among the various city officials, city department heads and city employees not included in the above classification shall be allowed a number of annual increments as hereinbefore provided according to their respective positions equal to the number of years of employment in their respective present positions.

SECTION 4. Part-Time Employment.

The Common Council, or any other officer who may be so authorized and empowered by the Common Council, may employ persons on a part-time basis to perform any of the duties of the positions listed in Section 2 of this Local Law.

SECTION 5. Laws Repealed; Saving Clause. Local Law No. 1 of 1947 adding Section 11-B to Chapter 269 of the Laws of 1902 is hereby repealed in its entirety. Local Law No. 6 of 1948; Local Law No. 16 of 1948; Local Law No. 17 of 1948; Local Law No. 13 of 1948; Local Law No. 1 of 1949; Local Law No. 2 of 1949; Local Law No. 4 of 1949; Local Law No. 42 of 1949; Local Law No. 43 of 1949; Local Law No. 6 of 1950 and Local Law No. 4 of 1950 are hereby repealed. Provided, however, that any city officials or employee who has acquired any rights or benefits under the provisions of the Statutes shall not lose the same.

SECTION 6. Time of Taking Effect. This act shall take effect on January 1, 1951 after public hearing and approval by the Mayor

On roll call, Aldermen Holland, LeClair, Villoni, Demary and Slattery voted in the affirmative; no one in the negative, (Alderm Cardi being absent) CARRIED.
