

- \$10M in State funding awarded to the City through 2022.
- Includes several different revitalization efforts
- Each effort Identifies a number of priority targets and projects
- Many of these projects are happening in parallel over the next several years

### **DRI Priorities**

#### **Riverfront Access**

- Macdonough Park: lighting, landscaping, paths, amphitheater, waterfront landing
- Riverfront boardwalk at Durkee Street: widening, surfacing, extension, benches, lighting
- River overlook with lighting, seating, and informational plaques
- Kayak launch with pad, ramp, railings, and storage
- Improvements to other walkways




Parallel Projects

#### Saranac River Trail Phases 2 & 3

- Phase 2: up to Broad Street from the south (Spring 2019)
- Phase 3: near MLD/treatment plant (Dock Street to pedestrian bridge)

#### **Dock Street Development**

- Minimal effects on other projects
- Anticipated 2019/2020


#### **Durkee Street: City Center**

- Awaiting developer and concepts
- Retail/office/residential with outdoor space
- Possible 2019 start
- Design, approval & construction
- Need for parking plan
- Intersects with streetscapes (Durkee Street, Bridge Street) and riverfront boardwalk/overlook



#### **NYSEG Remediation**

- Phased, anticipated through 2023
- 2020: Broad St to Bridge St (access at Broad St)
- 2021: Macdonough area (access near RR tracks & MLD)
- 2022: potential mouth of river/MLD area (TBD per testing)
- Impacts to Green Street (access route) and river access (riverbank restoration)




# Downtown Marketing, Branding, and Signage

# Riverfront Access & Streetscapes in Context

#### **Riverfront Access**

- Macdonough Park: lighting, landscaping, paths, amphitheater, (waterfront landing)
- Riverfront boardwalk at Durkee Street: (coordinate design with development)
   widening, surfacing, extension, benches, lighting
- River overlook with lighting, seating, and informational plaques
- (Kayak launch) with pad, ramp, railings, and storage
- Improvements to other walkways

#### Physical river access – delayed due to NYSEG work, but <u>concepts</u> can be developed for future CFA funding applications

• Can also improve visual access






# Which of the following riverfront access improvements would you most like to see along the Durkee Street waterfront? (Select up to 3)














# Which of the following riverfront access improvements would you most like to see at Macdonough Park?






# In your opinion, what types of streetscape design improvements would most benefit downtown Plattsburgh? (Select up to 4)













## Recognizing a limited budget, how should the funding be allocated?











# Which of the following DRI-identified priority downtown streets would benefit the city the most from some of the design improvements listed above?








# What types of improvements would make the park a more welcoming and active place for people? (Select up to 3)










#### What would make the biggest improvement to downtown?

#### Written Responses

"Creating space for bicycles (bike lanes, parking) would attract more visitors to downtown Plattsburgh, making it a destination, rather than a "passing-through" area. Creating more bike and pedestrian friendly walkways would help beautify the area while limiting traffic and keeping it easily accessible."

"Improved access to the waterfront and business support so that there are interesting reasons to make downtown a destination."

"We walk downtown almost nightly in the summer with our young children but just loop and go home. If there was a playground to stop at, or a dock to throw rocks off of over the water, we'd definitely stay down there longer."


## Pedestrian & Bicycle Study

#### Streetscape Enhancements & Riverfront Access





#### Overview:

These projects propose the design and construction of enhanced access to the Saranac River and improvements to streets and walkable areas Downtown. All streetscape enhancements and invertiont access improvements seek to add recreational opportunities and increase instation, connectivity, and a better flow of pedestrian traffic.

Streetscape enhancements may include but are not limited to, sidewalk widening, public performance venues, traffic calming measures, and green space enhancements.

Riverfront access improvements may include, but are not limited to, reconstruction of riverwalk/boardwalk, waterfront landings, overlooks, and more.

#### Update: Jan 2018

On January 23rd, 2018, the City of Plattsburgh released a Request for Proposals (RFP) for Consulting and Engineering Design Services for Streetscape Enhancements and improved Riverfront Access Designs. Find the full RFP documents bere. Responses are due by 3:00 p.m. (EST) Fridey, Feb 23rd, 2018.

#### Update: May 2018

At the regular meeting of Common Council on May 24th, the Common Council approved the Consulting and Engineering Design Services contract for the Downtown Streetscape and Riverfront Access Design project of the Downtown Revitalization initiative (DRI) be awarded to Saratoga Associates Landscape Architects, Architects, Engineers, and Planners, D

#### Update: August 2018

On August 1st, the City hosted a kick-off meeting for the Streetscape Improvements and Riverfront Access Project, with City staff, a DOS representative, and Sarktoga Associates. Sarktoga Associates next step is to review the existing conditions of the Downtown, review existing documentation and information, and start developing their public involvement plan.

#### Update: September 2018

Saratoga Associates' has begun their first round of public engagement. This includes dot polls in 4 different locations for 10 days at City Hall, the Bagel Pit. Platsburgh Public Library and the North Country Co-Dp. The dot polls were also available for 4 hours during the Battle of Platsburgh as well as 2 hours during the Farmer's Market on September 22nd.

Focus groups also took place with 30-minute sessions at Senior Citizens Council of Clinton County, Lake City Development Corporation Stafford Middle School, and Plattsburgh High School.

Saratoga Associates' also conducted a walkability study measuring the amount of pedestrian/bioycle traffic at select locations Downtowr. This study will help Saratoga Associates determine the existing walkability numbers as well as to better understand the flow of people through the Downtown.
