

At a Regular Meeting of the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, held June 20, 1952.

PRESENT: Mayor Tyrell, Aldermen Holland, LeClair, Villoni, Stewart and Cardi.

ABSENT: Alderman Demary.

LOCAL LAW NO. 3 OF 1952

A LOCAL LAW of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, to provide for a mandatory referendum on any bond resolution and capital note resolution exceeding \$250,000.00.

BE IT ENACTED by the Common Council of the City of Plattsburgh, New York, as follows:

SECTION 1. A. No bond resolution or capital note resolution exceeding the amount of \$250,000.00 adopted by the Common Council shall hereafter become effective until it shall have been approved at a mandatory referendum as hereinafter provided.

B. The provisions of this act shall not apply to bond resolutions authorizing the issuance of bonds for the payment of judgments, or compromised or settled claims against the City, or awards or sums payable by such City pursuant to a determination by a court, or an officer, body or agent acting in an administrative or quasi-judicial capacity.

SECTION 2. Whenever the Common Council shall adopt a bond resolution or capital note resolution exceeding the amount of \$250,000.00 it shall, at the same meeting, by resolution provide for a referendum thereon, to be held not more than thirty calendar days after the date of such meeting.

SECTION 3. The Hours during which the referendum shall be held shall be as provided in the provisions of the City Charter relating to special elections.

SECTION 4. All qualified electors of the City eligible to vote at the last previous general election shall be eligible to vote at the referendum provided herein.

SECTION 5. The resolution providing for the referendum shall include the proposition to appear on the ballot, shall fix the date and place or places for such referendum, and shall authorize and direct the City Clerk to publish a notice in the official newspaper of the City, once in each of two successive weeks with the second publication not later than ten days before the date of referendum.

The notice for publication shall include the ballot proposition and shall state the date, place or places and hours during which the referendum will be held.


SECTION 6. After the canvass of votes as provided in the City Charter for special elections, the City Clerk shall certify to the Common Council and to the chief fiscal officer of the City the results of the referendum and if the proposition shall have been approved, the bond resolution or capital note resolution as adopted by the Common Council shall then be effective.

SECTION 7. This act shall be in effect on July 1, 1952, and thereafter, after public hearing and approval by the Mayor.


On roll call, Aldermen Holland, LeClair, Villoni, Stewart, and
